
Brunswick Zebras Football Club Code of Conduct



PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

- 1. Encourage players to play by the rules.
- 2. Respect officials' decisions and teach players to do likewise If you have an issue to raise with the coach, speak to your Team Manager first.
- 3. Encourage participation, don't force.
- 4. Applaud good play by all teams players learn best by example.
- 5. Focus on the players efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- 6. Never ridicule or yell about mistakes or losing the game.
- 7. Respect people's differences, discrimination and vilification is not ok, either verbal and/or physical. This can be about someone's race, religion, gender, abilities, or sexual orientation, amongst others.
- 8. Fellow Club members, call out poor behaviour when you see or hear something.
- We are a community club. Show respect and appreciation of volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, the Club can not operate.
- 10. Co-operate with your Team Manager, fulfil your assigned duties on the dates you are rostered, or arrange a suitable swap with another parent.
- Consider what else you can do to support the club? skills, contacts or just time, speak to your Team Manager.
- 12. Do not coach from the sidelines during games, unless specifically asked by the Coach or Team Manager. Shouting instructions when you are not the coach, however helpful you may think they are, is unsporting behaviour and only confuses and distracts the players.
- 13. Do not smoke or consume alcohol near the team bench (Technical Area) or sideline.

PLAYERS

- 1. Play by the rules.
- 2. Be a good sport. Applaud good play whether it is by your team or the opposition. Shake hands with the opposition at the end of the game.
- 3. Work hard for yourself and your team. You team's performance will benefit and so will you.
- 4. Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.
- 5. Co-operate and show respect to your coach, team manager, team mates and opponents. Without them, there would be no competition.
- 6. Never argue with a referee or official. If you disagree, talk to your captain, coach or team manager during a break or after the competition.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials or other players is not ok, nor is deliberately detracting or provoking another player.
- Appreciate everyone is different, and discrimination or antisocial behaviour and language is not ok.
- Stand up and call out bad behaviour when you see or hear it.
- 10. Play for the fun of it, and not just to please parents and coaches.
- 11. Attend training and matches regularly. If you can't come, make sure you ring your coach or your team manager to let them know beforehand!
- 12. Remove all jewellery, and manage hair prior to training and match play, hazards for you and those around you.
- 13. Do not accept or use any banned or unauthorised drug(s), including the consumption of alcohol at any time.
- 14. Be responsible with social media, don't post images or comments that cause harm, impact the reputation of you or the club.
